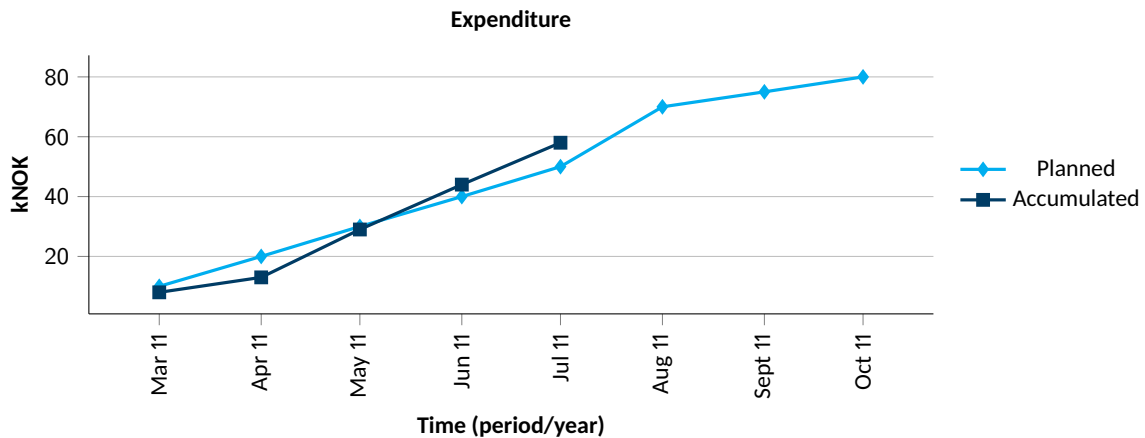

2 Progress in the last period

This new \LaTeX class for SINTEF status reports was produced. This is also supposed to be compiled with \XeLaTeX or \LuaLaTeX , due to the presence of SINTEF font specifications.

Most commands to set the fields in the start page will be shown in the PDF when compiling the document without them, so just compile and read if you are not sure.

3 Deviations from the plan

The only non-self-explaining commands are those for the budget plots. In order to set the data, you need to use the `\plannedexpenditures` and `\accumulatedexpenditures` commands. These take a list of coordinates (x for dates, y for *thousands* of crowns¹). The data is input as follows:

There is nothing wrong with putting the data points on the same line inside the braces, though I prefer them stacked so I can look them up more easily.

If you need to report your budget progress in another currency, you can use the `\currency` command; typically, you will type `\currency{€}`.
